



#### **HISTORY CORNER**

#### The story of the school flag

At the beginning, the school did not have its own flag. Approaching the 25th anniversary of MHG (1931), discussions were held during the meeting of the Parents' Committee (17.09) about what to give the school as a present. everyone agreed with the proposal to present a flag. It was thought that the flag would cost at about 200-300 kroons and the colours were proposed to be the national colours (blue-black-white) but the combination was to be decided by the Flag Committee. The Flag Committee's member was also Elisabeth Luiga, the Head of Studies at the time. A week after the meeting (25.09) the Flag Committee introduced the sketch of the flag to the parents: one side of the flag was vintage pink with the school's logo in the middle, and the other side was white with a sun rising and the name of the school. The cost of the flag was estimated for 250 kroons. The flag design got approved. A couple of weeks later (09.10), after it had turned out that it is not possible to get the silk in the vintage pink colour neither from Tartu nor from Tallinna, the discussions started again. There was no time to order the fabric from abroad anymore, so they debated whether it would be reasonable to paint the fabric instead. But that would have brought extra cost and risks. Therefore, they decided to abandon the pink colour and replace it with blue, that was available at the time, thinking that it was even more appropriate. The committee confirmed blue and white as the official flag colours of the school flag stating that the blue was more appropriate than pink. (RA. EA. 3460.1.663, I.49-51)

With the Soviet regime, the use of all previous symbols had been forbidden and it was not possible to use the school flag they had had anymore. So, when the school received the name of Miina Härma (in 1964, the composer's 100th birthday), then the Parents' Committee decided to present the school with a flag once more. The design of the flag still had the colours and the design of the flag from 1931. The school name and logo were embroidered with yellow on the white background. (Sajandi kool. Sada aastat Miina Härma Gümnaasiumi. Tartu 2006. pg.103). Today's flag of MHG is also white with the embroidery of the name and logo in yellow. We have also started to use the vintage pink colour again as fragments in addition to the official colours as well as Roosa Raadio (Pink Radio) that portrays the teachers of our school.
