The students were prepared by Riina Murulaid.
- Great results from the Open Math Contest held on Dec 11. In the younger age group, Tonu Uustare (10a) received a high 2nd place and Lauri Saks (10a) 12th place. Karolin Ruumet from 92 became 27th and Karina Saealle from 9a became 44th. The Math teacher of all the students is Tiiu Sasi. Linda Maria Pool (8b) also received great results by reaching 56th place (supervisor Oliver Oll). In the older age group (grades 11 and 12), the best results were achieved by: Uku Andreas Reigo (12DP) 12th place, Hendrik Matvejev (12DP) 17th place, Joosep Toom (11DP) 27th place.

### **HISTORY CORNER**

The chronicle of one class by Ene Tannberg

60 years ago, in December 1962 the homeroom teacher of grade 5a, Jaan Mitt presented the school with a fancy chronicle book where his class wrote down stories about their activities until the graduation of the basic school (the class chronicle can be found in the school library). Into the chronicle, regular entries have been made by the class about the activities of the class with thematic illustrations, drawings and photos as well as documents related to the class students, poems and essays.


Back then, all students up to grade 4 were studying in the afternoon shift and switched to the morning from grade 5. This was a huge change with new subject teachers and homeroom teachers taking over which the first entry of the chronicle is talking about. The next entry describes how the whole school went to harvest potatoes in the local collective farm. A different class rode to the field each day and on October 1st, it was the turn of 5a. The class rode to the Nõgiaru collective farm at the back of a transport van where they worked until 4 pm along with the lunch break. By the end of the day, the most dedicated students were able to gather bushels of potatoes (a bushel was a huge wooden box that was used as a measurement tool in harvesting potatoes). At the beginning of October, before the school's birthday, the students organized a cleaning day for the schoolhouse where each class also created a poster slogan for the school and a thematic wall newspaper was put together. In the autumn, they also visited the Museum of Zoology and put together the class band. In the dodge ball contest, grade 5a received 2nd place.

A discipline contest was also announced in the autumn (during the 1st study quarter, timely attendance, in the 2nd study quarter behaviour, and in the 3rd study quarter recess behaviour were assessed). Grade 5a received 2nd place in the contest.

#### **HISTORY CORNER**

Women's Day, on March 8 was a festive day at school. As we can read from the entries of the chronicle, then no one made a "crib" that day as they usually did, the boys did not play tag in the hallways and everyone was quiet in the lessons. After the lessons, there was a formal ceremony in Aula where the Head of School acknowledged the best teachers and students as well as introduced the customs of Women's Day from other countries. In autumn, the class went hiking in the caves of Aruküla and on a field trip to Järvselja, Ahja, Big Egg Hill, Värska and Petseri. During the field trip that lasted for several days, new entries and illustrative photos were added to the chronicle.
