THE OVERALL WIN IN PHYSICS AND THE BEST COMBINED RESULT IN THREE SUBJECT AREAS IN THE CONTEST OF FIVE SCHOOLS GOES TO UKU ANDREAS REIGO

The final round of the **Contest of Five Schools** took place on January 13-14 and was organized by Miina Härma Gümnaasium with **Tiia Lepik** in the lead.

Our representatives in the traditional contest of Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry between five schools of our region (Hugo treffner Gümnaasium, Tartu Tamme Gümnaasium, Viljandi Gümnaasium, Nõo Gymnasium and Miina Härma Gümnaasium) were: Tõnu Uustare (10a), Laur Saks (10a), Triin Punab (10b), Joosep Kübar (10a), Keidi Käärmann (11DP), Joosep Toom (11DP), Jekaterina Lissovskaja (11DP), Uku Andreas Reigo (12DP), Liis Siigur (12DP), Mikk Rooden (12DP), Eetu Kalevi Heikkilä (12DP), Peter Kipp (12DP), Hendrik Matvejev (12DP), Liisa Oks (12DP), Maria-Helena Puidak (12a).

Our students received the overall first place in Physics, second place in Chemistry and in Mathematics.

Our students also received a double win in Chemistry: 1st place for Uku Andreas Reigo and 2nd place for Liis Siigur; 7th-8th place was shared between Keidi Käärmann and Liisa Oks, 10th place was awarded to Mikk Rooden.

In Physics, Uku Andreas Reigo received 2nd place and Liis Siigur 3rd place; Mikk Rooden and Eetu Kalevi Heikkilä shared 4th-7th place, Keidi Käärmann received 9th place.

In Mathematics, Uku Andreas Reigo shared 4th-5th place.

The overall best in the three subject areas combined was Uku Andreas Reigo. Liis Siigur received an overall 2nd place and Mikk Rooden 6th place. All three students are nominated for the scholarship. The name of Uku Andreas Reigo is recorded on the travelling award of Harri Keerutaja.

The supervisors of the students were: Riina Murulaid, Leo Aleksander Siiman, Jörgen Metsik, Hendrik Vija, Tiiu Sasi, Helle Sorge. The scholarship of the supervisors is awarded to our teacher of Chemistry and Physics, Riina Murulaid.










Our folk dance group "Härmatis" is celebrating their 10th anniversary on January 28 at 18.00.

HISTORY CORNER

A Chronicle of one class III Ene Tannberg

This week we will continue introducing the chronicle of one class. In September 1964, they began the 7th grade. 13 new members from the parallel class had joined them.

During the school year, a number of interesting collaborative activities took place: an excursion around Lake Võrtsjärve in autumn as well as visits to Jõheva and Viru counties in spring. The main focus of both events was the cultural background of the region: for example, visiting the home sites of the composer Aleksander Lätte and writer Eduard Vilde; visit to the home site of A. Rennit in Viljandi, the author of the lyrics of a well-known Estonian song "Mul meelen kuldne kodukotus... etc.

A number of different study trips took place during the homeroom meetings: a visit to the sculptor Anton Starkopf in Tähtvere where the students found out how to make statues from ground rocks. They also visited Aparaaditehas, Tartu Observatory Museum; participated in the poetry evening dedicate to the 100th birthday of Anna Haava. A member of the Science Academy, Jaan Eilart held a lecture about the Heritage sites (as 1965 was the year dedicated to the preservation of heritage sites) and a lesson was given by H. Mändsaar, a traffic inspector and cartoonist that drew pictures for the newspaper Edasi under the alias Vindi Volli.

The class had many pen pals from different countries: correspondence in Finnish took place with students from Äänekoski School in Finland; they wrote in Russian with their pen pals from Belarus, Mogiljovi and Yakutia. They also exchanged letters with youth from Hungary.

The most memoraböe school events mentioned were the English Night in November where the school system of England was introduced, English songs were sung and danced by and anecdotes in English were also told. A group of students from 7a visited the friendship festival in Jelgava where students lived with local families and performed in a concert as well as introduced our school.

The huge excitement was caused by a meeting with a foreign visitor. On September 28, a group of delegates from the youth association from Moscow were on a tour in Estonia and were also visiting Tartu. 12 students from our school were allowed to go and greet them at the Park Hotel. Songs were sung to the visitors and they could also sing along some of them. The most popular song was "Olgu jääv meile päike" sung in Russian but with a chorus in English. A song in English really surprised the visitor from Englan who signed autographs for our students after the event.

At the time, keeping classrooms tidy was the responsibility of the students. In September, the students were renovating their classroom: whitened the ceiling, painted the walls and the floor, washed the windows. From time to time they also needed to conduct deep cleaning in their classroom.

The students did a lot of charity work also in today's meaning. In spring 1964, the government had invited students to make our cities and towns more beautiful. The students from our school joined in the event and built a new fence to an eledery person living in Kalevi street. The material for the construction work was received from the city government and the fence was ready in a week. 7a also gathered 2000 kilograms of scrap paper.

The class chronicle was also designed artistically with Liivia Loona and Eve Jõgi as illustrators. Both students were also attending the Art School.
