HISTORY CORNER

Browsing the Chronicles V by Ene Tannberg

During the school year of 1990/91 external communication became more active compared to the previous years. Our students and teachers went on study trips to different countries: visited the schools of Champaign-Urbana in the USA, went to Sweden and Denmark. They welcomed visitors from Finland, the USA, and Sweden. In summary during the school year, they concluded that the foreign correspondence helped to improve the students' English skills and expand their understanding of the world. At the same time, the frequent travelling disturbed the school work and was economically challenging because of the price increase.

During the ceremony of the school's birthday, our own school hat was inaugurated. For this occasion, our graduate student Lehte Hainsalu dedicated a poem "Oma kooli müts" that was recited during the ceremony. Traditionally, a concert at Vanemuine was held to celebrate the anniversary of Miina Härma's birth. A regular trivia tournament was initiated where the winning class received a free field trip as a prize. Disco dances were organized by students (the DJs included Toomas Taube, Andre Maasikas and Kaupo Karelson) as well as dance nights with the band Justament. School's sports day in the UT sports hall was also a success as well as the traditional Tamme Relay Run. The theme day organized on April 24 is described in the chronicle in great detail. On that day, there was no school. Instead, different activities were held throughout the day for the whole school family: speech contest, tug of war, arm wrestling, skateboarding, basketball contest, trivia, a contest of pavement drawing, skills games as well as fire brigade demonstrations. A cafe was organized by students and open for the whole day. The day ended with a party in the schoolhouse with the school's own bands performing. There were two bands at MHG (The Claymakers and Alberts) that also participated in the national inspection of school bands "Koolirock'91" and received recognition from both the judges as well as the audience.

HISTORY CORNER

The students showed initiative to do something together and that collaboration promoted the development of a sense of community at school. An integral part of this process was played by the Student Council which was led by Asko Lõhmus. The board of the Student Council also included Meelis Friedenthal, Tarmo Tamm, Toomas Taube, Arne Otter and Liina Velsker.

The academic results were good. In the Contest of Five Schools, our school received a combined 2nd place (Nõo High School became 1). One of our students graduated with a gold medal and 11 students were awarded silver medals. Most of our students continued their studies in the universities.

In this school year, MHG had altogether 768 students, grades 1–5 were in the afternoon shift, there was an average of 35 students in one class. There were 70 teachers.
