## WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS <br> THE VISIT OF TEACHERS FROM SWEDEN

Just after the school holidays, on 31 October, four Swedish teachers visited MHG. The guests came from different schools in Uppsala and their trip to Tartu to get to know the local schools and university was mediated by the local Estonian representatives to the Nordic Council of Ministers. When arranging the itinerary, the teachers from Uppsala expressed their interest to visit Swedish language classes or meet Swedish-speaking pupils in schools where Swedish is taught. At the time of the trip, there were a total of two secondary schools in Tartu where Swedish is taught.

On the morning of 1 October, the guests arrived at our school after a stay at the HTG. First of all, our Swedish teacher Heikki Veinimäe introduced the guests to the school (both briefly about the history and the present MHG) by giving them a short tour of the building - they visited the lobby, the teachers' room, the 2nd floor classes and observed the classroom life. Finally, they arrived at the reading room of the school library, where they were met by the second year Swedish students of grade 11. The conversation, which had started off with a gentle start, turned into a lively exchange of questions and answers. Although the grade 11 pupils had not yet had any Swedish lessons this term after the summer break, they managed to have a good conversation in Swedish. The visitors were interested in how the pupils were doing at school, their attitudes towards school and learning, their hobbies and leisure activities, etc. They were also interested in how the pupils were getting on with their studies. The students asked questions to find out about the background of the visitors, the aims and content of their trip to Estonia and various facts about Sweden. The interviews revealed that three out of the four teachers worked as support teachers in classes with pupils with special needs and/or with a high proportion of immigrant pupils who did not speak enough Swedish. The fourth teacher was an intermediate level Mathematics teacher. The meeting in the reading room of the school library turned out to be about 30 minutes longer than originally planned.
From the MHG, the guests went on to the university to meet the people of the Scandinavian Studies Department.
