One of the highlights of 2022 was the opening of the Näituse Street building, which improved our school family's working conditions and eased the space shortage. The renewal of the upper secondary school curriculum and the opening of new study modules expanded our students' options.



Our students achieved outstanding results in Estonian and international Olympiads in Estonia and in various exams, all thanks to the work of our teachers.

The folk dance groups of Härmatis celebrated their 10th birthday, and our choirs have recovered from the ban on singing in the Covid era. The low-activity track opened in the schoolyard in spring and offers year-round fun. The traditional opportunity to skate on the school's ice-skating rink in winter is something very special and has inspired the creator of this year's Christmas card.

The Tartu Education Achievement of the Year nomination was awarded to recognise our work in creating and maintaining a shared value space at school. It is noteworthy that the students have chosen **good role models** from among themselves who carry the school's values and guide their actions.

Globally, the past year has been a **challenging year of crises**, which has presented challenges to the unity of the democratic world and opportunities for civic initiatives and cooperation. Our school family has been actively involved in various activities in support of the brave Ukrainian people.

MHG HIGHLIGHTS 2022

Values

- Recognition of the **Tartu Education Achievement of the Year** "Creating and maintaining a shared MHG value space".
- Egle-Diana Keldt was chosen as Tartu Primary Teacher of the Year, Jörgen Metsik as Secondary School Teacher of the Year and Regita Saksing as Social Pedagogue of the Year. Riina Murulaid was the most successful supervisor in preparing students for the Olympiads in Tartu.
- Henry Jürgenson, Gerli Raag, Uku Andreas Reigo, Katrina Laur, Matilda Mägi were chosen by students as role models.
- About 300 outstanding students were invited to attend the Principal's Reception in June.
- After a break of several years, the traditional Advent concert was held again. All MHG choirs performed at Pauluse Church.
- The folk dance groups of Härmatis celebrated their 10th anniversary.
- The MHG ball, "New Millennium," was organised by the students.

Studies

- At the graduation ceremony, 14 gold medals and 6 silver medals were awarded to students.
- For the first time, two IB DP students achieved maximum scores in the international final exams.
- Five of our students' research papers reached the second round of the national competition for students' research papers.
- 63 MHG students were invited to the final rounds of the Olympiads.
- In the Five Schools Competition, we achieved 1st place in Physics, 2nd place in Mathematics and 2nd place in Chemistry as a team.
- Grade 4 students presented their Exhibition projects in May, demonstrating the knowledge and skills acquired in the first four years by exploring real-life issues and problems.



MHG HIGHLIGHTS 2022

- During the IB DP study days "The Art of Science", MHG and Tallinn English College students worked together in the university's science labs, explored science as art and presented it in an art exhibition.
- For the first time in the history of the MHG, our youngest German language learners were awarded official DSD Al proficiency diplomas.
- New modules were opened in secondary school: International Relations and Diplomacy, Medicine and Healthcare, Environment Around Us, Business Ecosystem, Drama and Theatre, and Literature as a Way of Understanding the World.
- In September, the studies were extended to the Näituse 13a building.

Contribution to the Society

- Four Härma students were elected to the Tartu Youth Council.
- Teachers and alumni shared their experiences of Ukraine at the "Ukraine Stories" event.
- As an employer, we supported the large-scale operation "Siil".

- The legendary "Härma Trivia" started again.
- MHG Instagram has ~1700 followers; about 20+ stories about school life are published weekly.

Caring for our Health

- In April, we opened a low-activity track.

- The three-school mental health project "Success and Happiness" took place for the second time this year.
- First aid training was given to teachers and 9th-grade students.

- In the 9th-grade Physics Open Competition on 3 December, Art Hendrik Joandi (9b) and Linda Maria Pool (9b) shared 14th-15th place, Maria Alas (9a) was 21st, Mart Väljamäe (9b) 22nd and Ellen Hiiemari Möls (9a) 32nd. Riina Murulaid supervised the students. Erik Julius Lindgren (10b) shared 15th-16th place among the 10th grades, supervised by Riina Murulaid. In the 11th grade, Tõnu Uustare (11DP) came 14th, Laur Saks (11DP) 15th and Heorhii Pasternak (11DP) 17th, supervised by Leo Siiman.
