- Joosep Kübar and Lauri Sarap speak on the Roosa Radio programme "100 days in IB DP". Listen to the programme <u>HERE</u>.





- Tennis player Oliver Ojakäär (11b) competes in the Australian Junior Open.




WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

Miina Härma Gümnaasium has been offering IB programmes for more than ten years: we started with the Diploma Programme in 2011, followed by the accreditation of the Primary Years Programme in 2014 and the Middle Years Programme in 2019. MHG has therefore been a full-cycle IB World School for four years now.

Traditionally, IB schools have an evaluation visit every five years to acknowledge the school's progress and to celebrate the IB programmes in the school. Next week (1-3 February), our school is due for another visit, covering all IB programmes.

This time, IBO representatives will visit our school virtually using Zoom's online meetings. During the three days, they will talk to the management, teachers, students and parents and visit classes (again virtually).

The IB evaluation visit ends with a summary by the IBO team of what they experienced and saw during the three days at school. 








SCHOOLS IN MOTION

Quick breaks during lessons

Do the opposite!

- Everyone stands up.
- The leader is at the front of the class and makes a simple movement. The students do the opposite. E.g. if the leader raises his left arm, the pupils raise their right arm; if the leader bends forward, the pupils bend backwards; if the leader makes a circle over his left shoulder, the pupils make a circle over his right shoulder, etc.

2. Game 1, 2, 3

- The numbers 1, 2, 3 are counted together.
- Then 1 is replaced by a jump and is no longer said aloud.
- Then 2 is replaced by "ahoy!".
- Then 3 is replaced by a jump and a simultaneous shout of "Sunday".
- Do it a few times.
- Activities and shouts can be changed. It is a very useful exercise to "set the brain thinking", as both hemispheres of the brain need to be engaged.

3. Rock-paper-scissors

- Pupils pair up and play a game of rock-paper-scissors while jumping.
- Pupils read "rock-paper-scissors-one-two-three" and, at the word "three", jump into the correct position according to their chosen object. Jumping "STONE" is with feet together, "PAPER" is with feet on wide and "SCISSORS" is with feet crossed.
- The stone wins the scissors and loses to the paper. Paper beats stone and loses to scissors. The scissors beat the paper, lose to the stone.

4. Sleeping stork

- Everyone stands on their left foot and keeps their balance.
- Step up on the toes of the left foot.
- If possible, close your eyes and hold the position.
- Do the same with the right foot.

- 5. Shaking the body parts
 - Students stand up and start shaking body parts one by one (right arm, left arm, right leg, left leg, hips).
 - Then backwards (hips, left leg, ...).
- 6. Clapping game
- Pupils pair up, and the game leader randomly says numbers 1 to 3.
- No1 clap your partner with a left hand.
- No 2 clap to your partner with your right hand.
- No 3 clap your partner with both hands.
- 7. Ones and tens
 - It is agreed that the students will jump forward as many times as there are tens and backward as many times as there are ones.
 - The teacher starts to say the different two-digit numbers, and the students jump. For example: "Jump as many times as there are tens in 46."
 - The jumps are counted out loud.
