THE BEAUTY AND POWER OF THE ESTONIAN LANGUAGE

- Estonian Language Day is a national holiday celebrated since 1996 on 14 March, the anniversary of the birth of poet Kristjan Jaak Peterson. The national flags are raised on this day, and our pupils wear school hats. To celebrate the Estonian language and its beauty, we have organised a number of events this week.
- From 14 to 17 March, the school will hold an **Estonian Language Week for** grades 1 to 4, which will end with an act in which students will perform poems and prose texts of their choice.
- On 13 March, the upper secondary school had a mock exam in Estonian.
- Today, during the 2nd lesson, the students of the 6th-9th grades gathered in the library's study room to write a traditional dictation dedicated to the day. The winners have already been announced: grades 6-7, 1st Anni Maria Volt (6b), 2nd Hebe Linn Caceres (7b), 3rd Bente Marta Perm (7b) and among grades 8-9, 1st Katrina Laur (9a), 2nd Anette Jürgenson (9b), the 3rd-4th place was shared between Karl Luikmäe (8b) and Emma Mägi (8b). The dictation was composed by teacher Karmen Grigor.
- During lesson 3, interested secondary school students had the opportunity to write an e-dictation in the library.
- On 15 March, the writer **Tõnu Õnnepalu** will visit our school to meet 11th and 12th graders in the Aula during the 4th lesson.
- In the school essay competition "The power of words and the power of language", Mirtel Tähepõld (11b, teacher Jana Kübar) and Norah Elisabeth Ratas (10c, teacher Ivika Hein) were recognised for their excellent essays. Both students and their tutors will receive the book "Sõna on vaba" (The Word is Free), autographed by President Kersti Kaljulad, as a token of appreciation.
- Kaisa Tullus (7a, teacher, Jana Kübar) shared 8th-12th place in the younger age group (4th place in 7th grade) of the Estonian as Mother Tongue Olympiad. Margaret Luht (9b, teacher Auli Auväärt) came 4th in the middle age group (3rd among 9th grades), Saskia Jõgever (10a, teacher Auli Auväärt) was 12th-15th, Liis Marii Pakkanen came 25th. In the older age group, Mirtel Tähepõld (11b, teacher Jana Kübar) took 15th place overall and 5th in grade 11.
- Teele Piibemann (9b) won first place in the older age group (16-19 years) in the Republican competition for young people's original poems on 8 March.





WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

- In the regional round of the 4th-6th grade Maths Olympiad on 21 February, Saamuel Sööt (4b, teacher Teeli Roht) shared 1st-2nd place, Karoliina Parkel (4b, teacher Teeli Roht) shared 6th-9th place, and Helmi Russak (4a. teacher Kristel Anier) shared 10th-13th place. Lemme Toompere (5b, teacher Veronika Lehesaar) won first place among the 5th grades, Mihkel Metsla (5b, teacher Veronika Lehesaar) came 6th and Grete Audova (5a, teacher Kersti Õunap) 14th. The real sensation was Märt Mattias Alase (3b, teachers Kirke Lindlo-Bleahu and Hendrik Matvejev), who received 1st place among the 6th grades! Silvia Kronberg (6a, teacher Ave Hussar) came 11th, and Anni Maria Volt (5b, teacher Kersti Õunap) came 15th.
- On the basis of the work in the preliminary round of the Finnish Language Olympiad, Serena Sarapuu (11c) will be invited to the final round. Her Finnish teacher is Reet Volmer.
- In the regional round of the Economics Olympiad, Maria Kuris (11b) won 4th place, Eva Kristine Tammine shared 5th-6th, Sander Metsis (12a) was 9th, and Kaspar Parksepp (12a) 12th-13th. The supervisor was Tiina Aidnik. Maria Kuris and Eva Kristine Tammine were also invited to the national round of the Economics Olympiad.
- Uku Raudmäe (8b, teacher Heiki Puusepp) won 2nd place in the 8th grade English Olympiad in Tartu, Grete Arujõe (8a, Heiki Puusepp) shared 6th-7th place, Emma Mägi (8b, Heiki Puusepp) got 16th place.
- In the 26th national competition for school vocal ensembles dedicated to Alo Mattiisen, which was held as part of the Music Days, the Grand Prix was awarded to the ensemble CVARTETICA, of which Gloria Raudjärv (8b) was a member.
