Head of School Ene Tannberg welcomed the participants as President of the Tartu School Leaders' Association. On the second day, workshops took place. Tiia Lepik, Head of Development, conducted a workshop on "Designing and Implementing a Values Curriculum". Kirstin Karis, IB Coordinator, conducted a workshop on "Increasing student choice and autonomy in designing the secondary school curriculum (using the IB Diploma Programme as an example)", and Terje Hallik conducted a workshop on "Identifying and supporting talent". Each school in Tartu also gave a poster presentation. The authors of our poster presentation were Terje Hallik, Tiia Lepik, Triinu Pihus and Liis Somelar.
