 On 1 April, the final round of the Estonian Literature Olympiad of the Estonian Association of Teachers of Modern Literature took place at Miina Härma Gümnaasium. Teacher Ivika Hein was a member of the organising committee.
Our 9th-10th grade team, consisting of Iris Kivi, Linda Maria Pool and Ellen Hiiemari Möls, won 4th place, and the 11th-grade team, consisting of Mirtel Tähepõld, Maria Kuris and Matilda Mägi, was awarded the 12th place.





- In the preliminary round of the Maths competition NUPUTA Tartu held on 30 March, MHG I team won 2nd place among the 7th grades. MHG II team came 5th. With this result, the MHG I team qualified for the final competition.
- On 29 March, Laura Karolina Gradickaite (11c) was awarded 8th place in the Russian language competition for secondary school pupils in the city of Tartu in the category of pupils graduating from Estonian-language basic schools. Alina Priks (12b) took 2nd place in the category of pupils graduating from Russian-medium primary schools, Amelia Zaytseva (10b) 5th, Polina Trubatšova (12b) 8th and Sofja Tretjakova (11a) 11th. The students were supervised by Jelena Nikolajeva.



- The MHG team came first in the Tartu Schools Open Chess Cup Tournament on 2 April. Mihkel Tomson (10b) was the individual winner, Linda Maria Pool (9b) achieved 5th place, and Märt Mattias Alas (3b) shared 14th-15th place.
- Mia Karolina Altküla (11a) will be travelling to the World Debating
 Championships as a member of the Estonian team! WSDC 2023 will take place
 in Vietnam from 18-28 July.
- On March 27th, the 7th-9th grade boys played volleyball in the EKSL school league and achieved 2nd place among Tartu schools. Playing for our school were: Tinto Kuusk (9b), Ekke Villem Laanoja (9b), Kaarel Kull (9a), Karl Markus Sarapuu (9a), Roland Saar (8b), Uku Raudmäe (8b), Aron-Madis Karelson (8b), Villem Piirimäe (8b) and Andre Hal (8b).
- In the national competition of the Estonian Music Schools Association, "Best Young Instrumentalist 2023", **Janno Lani** (euphonium) achieved 3rd place in 4th grade. (Tartu II Music School, teacher Gunnar Pettaig, concertmaster Kaja Bleive)
- On 22 March, Geia Rõivas (10a) participated in the work shadowing day at the Ministry of Justice. Kaidi Lippus, Head of the Courts Service, supervised the day. During the day, Geia could participate in meetings and group work. She also got a more detailed overview of the work of the Department of Justice Administration Policy.
- 31.03-2.04, The first World Championships of gymnastics in 2023 took place in Sofia, Bulgaria, where Emili Saar (9b) of the junior group Diente of Janika Gymnastics Club participated. The group achieved a very high 4th place in the international competition. The next rounds of the World Championships will take place in France and Finland at the end of April and May.





An exhibition of the work of grade 10 B1 French students is on display in the lobby of the school building on the 1st floor, next to classroom 104. It is made up of four posters presenting the districts of Tartu and their voices. The selection includes the city centre, Karlova, Supilinn and Raadi-Kruusamäe. The posters are audio-annotated, and OR codes can be used to



listen to the introductions in French, see photos and anything else that students have thought they should add. The project was supervised by teacher Aija Sprivul-Dautancourt.





On 31 March, the MHG welcomed school leaders from Lithuania. They were introduced to our school by the Head of School, Ene Tannberg, and our Lithuanian language teacher, Reda Šmitaite, who translated her speech into Lithuanian.





- On 31 March, the prizes of the national competition for works in education were awarded at the University of Tartu. In the category of published and/or defended doctoral theses or monographs, our biology teacher Helen Semilarski was awarded the second prize for her doctoral thesis "Improving Students' Self-efficacy in the Acquisition of Subject and crosscurricular framework Themes and 21st-century skills to promote meaningful learning in Science".

- On 29 March, another workshop for Tartu school leaders took place.
- This time, the host was Miina Härma Gümnaasium, and the topic was point 2 of the Quality Agreement for Tartu Schools:
- "Tartu schools develop a science-based mindset and academic literacy. The schools of Tartu have agreed on the basic components of a science-based mindset, which are developed in different school levels. Academic literacy (including the formatting of written work), vocabulary related to academic and literate style and academic reading skills are developed to support the development of critical information users. Academic honesty is an essential part of any educational institution's working and learning culture."
- In reality, we talked more about the possibilities for implementing ChatGPT in the work of teachers and school leaders. Lemmit Kaplinski, Deputy Mayor of Tartu for Education and Culture, also attended the event. The event was organised and prepared by Terje Hallik, Head of Studies.
- In episode #5 of the "Tartu Hariduse Hääl" series, the conversation was about science-based thinking with Terje Hallik, Head of MHG, and Enn Ööpik, Head of Tartu Mart Reiniku School. Our school has a distinguished history and traditions. We have motivated students.


- Our teachers are experts in their field.
