• On May 4, Swedish King Carl XVI Gustaf and Queen Silvia visited Tartu as part of their state visit. To mark this event, Swedish language teacher Heikki Veinimäe prepared a slide program for the information TV in the lobby of the school building, introducing the entire school family to the lives of the distinguished guests. The royal couple was greeted by students from the grade 10 and 11 Swedish language groups of MHG and the children from grade 5 who had just learned about the "good old Swedish times" as part of their history lessons. At 11:25, the royal couple of Sweden and the Estonian president with his wife arrived at the Town Hall Square. After the mayor's welcome ceremony, the guests headed to the hall of the university's main building. At the same time, the students of MHG headed to the statue of Gustaf II Adolf behind the main building of UT, where the guests arrived twenty minutes later. After the guests left, the students returning to school brought along pleasant memories of the event and the Swedish flags distributed on the Town Hall square.







- On 2 May, our history teacher and alumnus of Noarootsi High School, Ilmar Tammisto, defended his doctoral thesis "Nobility and state in Swedish Livland <u>1634–1680</u>" (supervisor: associate professor Enn Küng from the University of Tartu, opponent: researcher Dr Astrid Wendel-Hansen from the University of Jena, Germany.) Ilmar summarizes his doctoral thesis as follows: "Everyone, who has studied the history of Estonia, has at least some idea of the Baltic German nobility as well as the time when the territory of modern Estonia was part of the Swedish state. In the same way, the image of a cruel and greedy landlord who only stood up for his narrow private interests easily emerges. In my doctoral thesis, I set myself the goal of offering additional interpretations of the aspirations and attitudes of the Swedish state power and the Baltic German nobility. I focused on Livonia, part of the Swedish state (today's Southern-Estonia and Northern-Latvia administrative unit located in Latvian territories) in 1634–1680.
- During the period in question, the influence of the local nobility in Livonia grew significantly, and a network of institutions managed by the nobility developed, which in many ways formed a parallel administrative structure next to the national one. In my work, I wanted to find out, other things, why the Swedish among government allowed such a situation to arise and what the nobles of Livonia tried to achieve with the help of their strengthened position. I concluded that the expectation of mutual benefit drove the described largely developments. By making concessions to the Livonian nobility, the Swedish government hoped to obtain additional resources from them in return and secure the loyalty of the local nobility to the Swedish state. "
