- On May 11, MHG team with Merit Ots (11a), Mirtel Tähepöld (11b), Emma Elisabeth Toots (11c) and Kertu Raudsepp (11c) received 4th place in the literary trivia KIMM for secondary school level.
- Kaisa Tullus (7a, teacher Jana Kübar) received a special prize at the Ulakass review competition for her review of Stephen King's fantasy work "Dragon's Eyes".
- On May 8, a trivia game was held for the 7th time at Jaan Poska Gümnaasium in Tartu. Results: 2nd place MHG 9th grade team (Ellen Hiiemari Möls, Linda Maria Pool, Iris Kivi), 3rd place 7b team (Ida Parmas, Kristiina Sellis, Otto Pärtel Palm), 4th place 7a team (Kaisa Tullus, Lille-Mai Kangur and Triinu Liis Kuul).
- In the final round of the Geography Olympiad, 7b student Leo Fišel achieved 3rd rank (equal to 3rd place). He also had the best result in the multimedia round and the third result in the written work. Among the 9th grades, Rasmus Sasi (9a) had the fourth result in the written work. • On 11-13 May, our 12b student Lene Tiinas successfully represented Miina Härma Gymnasium at Riga's Baltic German Language Olympiad. Lene Tiinas received recognition in two Olympiad categories: 1st place in presenting her interests through the prism of her hometown (oral task) and 1st place in group work, where the task was to create a more sustainable solution for Riga's old shopping centre and present it convincingly. The 5 best German speakers from Latvia, Lithuania and Estonia national rounds were invited to the Olympiad. The Olympiad consisted of three rounds. At the German Embassy, the students presented their homework, the topic of which was "Meine Interessen durch das Prisma meines Wohnorts." On the second day, there was a test of linguistic knowledge and group work in international groups and its presentation to the audience. Lene's German teacher is Maigi Varusk.

On May 12, the spring concert of the mixed choir of the Miina Härma Singing Society took place in the MHG Aula. MHG children's choir of grades 3-4 was also invited to perform at the concert to share the love of music with the next generation. Both choirs are conducted by Külli Karask.

The mixed choir of Miina Härma Singing Society considers itself the conceptual successor of the mixed choir of Miina Hermann Singing Society, which was founded by Miina Härma (formerly Hermann) in 1894. At one time, it became the best concert choir in Estonia. Miina Härma was a long-time music teacher of the Girls' Gymnasium of the Estonian Youth Education Society (she worked at the school from 1917 to 1929) that preceded Miina Härma Gümnaasium. In her honour, MHG teachers created a MHLS mixed choir in April 2013, which was joined not only by teachers, but also by parents, alumni and other friends of MHG and choral music. The founder and first conductor of the choir was Kadri Leppoja, and the current leader is Külli Karask. All singers are united by the love of music and the joy of singing together. The members of the choir have formed a large and strong group of friends.

The MHLS mixed choir has participated twice in Estonian song festivals and twice in Tartu song festivals. They took part in Uma Pidos in the Võru language and performed at Elva and Intsikurmu song festivals; they also performed at the singing days of Estonian Mixed Choirs Union and Tartu county choirs. It is a great honour to participate in MHG concert events. The choir's wish is to keep the tradition of choral music and the love for music alive and to create a pleasant gathering place for the MHG family.

With an independent concert, the choir performed for the first time and performed songs from the classics of Estonian choral music and the newer repertoire.
