"From 13-15 September, I managed to take part in the European Commission's study trip to Brussels for teachers of History and IAS. The program was busy but very educational. There was an opportunity to learn more about the behind-the-scenes of European foreign policy, which was illuminated by the Estonian ambassador to the European Union, Aivo Orav, and the European External Action Service's vision of China's influence activities. From a pedagogical perspective, it was refreshing to hear about teaching at the European School and to hear how our former math teacher, Kristi Kreutzberg, is doing. A visit to the House of European History was also not missed - a museum whose exhibitions consist of the assets of the museums of the member states. Of course, a lot of attention was also paid to the work of the European Commission and the exchange of ideas between colleagues."


