

MHG teachers organized several workshops: Alla Vinitšenko ("Study trips organized by the subject teacher in Estonia and abroad"), Regita Saksing ("Supporting a child who has experienced a traumatic event at school"), Karin Kannerma, Egle-Diana Keldt, Gerli Puis ("The joy of primary teachers' collaboration"), Triinu Pihus, Terje Hallik ("Artificial intelligence at school. Three practical tools for teachers" followed by the discussion "The challenges and opportunities of AI"), Age Raimets ("Shaping class spirit through movement"), Maigi Varusk (Roosa Radio recording at Õ-club "Hea klapp").
- Arabella Elisabeth Saavo (10c), Henrik Harjus (11a) and Marie-Liset Tauts (11c) were elected as members of the Tartu Youth Council. Congratulations!
- In the children's and youth literature festival LUUP poetry competition, Keiti Olgo (12a) took 3rd place among secondary school students. Supervised by Jana Kübar.
- On October 21, the D. O. Wirkhaus competition for young wind and percussion players at the music schools of Tartu municipality took place. Adeele Kams received a diploma playing the flute (7a, Tartu Music School I). Her teacher is Kristin Müürsepp, and her concertmaster is Tommaso Maganzani.

- On 30.10, colleagues from Rocca al Mare School visited MHG. The goal was to meet subject teachers and see classes and students. Conversations with teachers took place about teaching and getting to know the school.
- For the second time in the history of MHG, German language learners received official DSD A1 and A2 level diplomas. A total of 23 students completed A1 level tests, and 8 students completed A2 level tests. This achievement aligns with the language policy of Miina Härma Gümnaasium, which aims not only to learn foreign languages but also to achieve the required levels in the languages being studied.
