#### **MIINA HÄRMA 160**

Miina Härma was the first Estonian female composer, the first female organist and the first female conductor, one of the sewists of the first blue-black-white flag. She taught at the world's first Estonian-language secondary school and, in 1939, was elected as the first woman to receive an honorary doctorate from the University of Tartu. She has been selected as one of the 100 great Estonian figures of the 20th century.

Miina Härma was born on 9 February, 1864 in Kõrveküla, Tartu County. Her father was a schoolmaster who conducted the local choir and orchestra. After graduating from the municipal school, Miina Härma's education continued at the German-speaking Schultze private school in Tartu.

It is extraordinary that in 1883 she had the courage to travel to St. Petersburg to take the entrance exams to the conservatory. At first, she studied the piano but soon switched to the organ class. The great city of Petersburg remained her residence for 11 years. Alongside and after her studies, Miina Härma's professional musical life began - she gave singing lessons and concerts, conducted choirs, wrote music and even went on tours in Germany and England. In 1894, homesickness brought Miina Härma back to Tartu. Although there was a lot of musical activity here, it was still not enough to support oneself. In 1903, she went to Kroonlinn, where she worked as a music teacher, but she also spent time composing music. In 1904, her stage play "Murueide Tütar" was performed in Kroonlinn.

The hardships of the First World War and the expectation of the emerging republic forced many Estonian sons and daughters to leave the expanses of Russia and return to their homeland. "Talents home!", said Tartu. So Miina Härma came to Taaralinn and, in 1917, started working as a music teacher at the Girls' Gymnasium of the Estonian Youth Education Society. Beloved Teacher worked in our school until 1929. In 1964, on the 100th anniversary of Miina Härma's birth, the school was named after her.


Miina Härma died on 16 November 1941, escaping the depressing grip of the Soviet government. She is buried at the Raadi cemetery. Every birth anniversary, the students of our school visit her grave.

Miina Härma's musical heritage is worthy of respect - she wrote more than 200 choral songs, was the conductor at all public singing parties, her "Tuljak" composed to the words of Karl Ferdinand Karlson speaks to every Estonian even today. Miina Härma's "Tuljak" was created by Anna Raudkats, and as such, it is the grand finale of every general dance party.

She is one of the legendary English teachers of Miina Härma Gümnaasium, who has always been ready to immerse herself in modern teaching methods and develop new elective courses; she has developed the teaching of English in our school. Reet has contributed significantly to the substantive development of English language teaching nationwide.

Teacher Noorlaid started working at our school after graduating from the University of Tartu in 1967 and taught even a year ago when we needed a substitute teacher. Reet Noorlaid is an active, energetic, cheerful and helpful colleague. What has been admirable has been her fanaticism and unwavering commitment to school-work-related goals and activities.

Teacher Noorlaid has taught English, journalistic English, business English academic English; she has organized written and simultaneous translation courses in collaboration with university lecturers and guided students in preparing for student competitions. Teacher Noorlaid has shared her wealth of experience with university's teacher-training students. 
