- On 15-16 March, in the final round of the Chemistry Olympiad, MHG was represented by Erik Meriloo (9a, teacher Helle Sorge), 13th place; Nurkhan Torekhanov (Pre-IB, teacher Jörgen Metsik), 2nd place; Uku Nael (10b, Jörgen Metsik), 6th place; Karolin Ruumet (11a, Jörgen Metsik, Helle Sorge), 14th place; Laur Saks (12DP, coached by Jörgen Metsik), 13th place.
- 6-7 MHG has been invited to the final round of the Physics Olympiad on 6-7 April with the largest representation among the secondary schools of the city of Tartu: Ott Loper (8b), Sherkhan Torekhanov (Pre-IB), Uku Nael (10b), Jeližaveta Štšura (10b), Uku Märt Raasik (10b), Erik Julius Lindgren (11b), Andri Türkson (11b), Karolin Ruumet (11a), Laur Saks (12DP), Triin Punab (12DP). #### **NEPAL TRAVELOGUE, VOL 1**

• Our winding journey began in the foggy early morning at the Tartu bus station. We bravely passed through both Tallinn and Istanbul airports and took the last 7-hour night flight to Kathmandu. Instead of a night of sleep, we were entertained by in-flight screens and packaged water cups. The two days following the flight were spent enjoying the pleasures of the capital. The Härmatis team got to know Kathmandu - we learned how to trade like the locals, saw colourful people, motorcycles and dogs on the streets, and made our first discoveries about the intriguing architecture and way of life. There seemed to be no longing for the water and air at home - there were plenty of new and interesting things. We also offered something new and interesting to our locals - repeatedly, the unearthly tall, blue-eyed tourists were asked to take pictures. The first guided tour took us to the Swoyambhu Maha chaitya temple complex decorated with colourful flags. Here and in the future, we began to notice the enormous tolerance of the Nepalese people. The temple complex in the picture is simultaneously a sanctuary for followers of Buddhism and Hinduism, and we, too, felt welcomed and valued there. That day, we also got to be a part of the local wildlife when a curious macaque monkey set its sights on Henry's drink. The reader is left to guess how the situation was resolved. The next day, the first parade and the festival's official opening took place. It must be said that the experience was... different from the song and dance party parade we are familiar with. The same warm hearts and bright smiles greeted us on the narrower streets in the midst of heavier traffic. After that, it was the first opportunity of the trip to share Estonian folk dance in the open air. On that day, it became clear to all of us exactly how the calm mind of the Nepalese translates into their schedules. For example, Agnes got ribbons in her hair only in the parking lot just a few minutes before arriving at the concert hall. The energetic and cheerful "After Breakfast" was chosen as the opening number of the folk dancers. Of the other countries, the best first impression was the dances of India, Austria and Poland, where each cultural space was completely unique. We also took the opportunity to take a picture with our favourites in front of the Estonian poster after the concert.

• For as many Nepalese people as possible to participate in the festival, we set off in a bus full of good dancers at 5 o'clock the next morning to perform with "Tuurit-Tuuriti" and "Kaera-Jaan" in the city of Ghorah.
