

### **NOTICED AT HÄRMA**

- For the 13th time, the European Girls' Mathematical Olympiad (EGMO) took place in Georgia. **Karolin Ruume**t (11a) was part of the Estonian team.
- On 17 April, **Eliis Guhse** (3b) took 2nd place, and **Stefan Robin Lepp** (9b) took 3rd place in the smart sports national finals in Pärnu.
- In the five-stage history quiz Mammut, **Adeele Tuisk** (5b) achieved national 4th place (1st stage), **Marta Birk** (5b) got 8th place (2nd stage), 26th place (2nd stage) went to **Saamuel Sööt** (5b) and 46th place (3rd stage) to **Timmo Tomingas** (5b). **Marten Miljukov** (5b), **Tiit Haabma** (5b), **Johan Antalainen** (5a), **Meeri Hallik** (5.), **Laurete Visnapuu** (5a) and **Mari Hallik** (5b) were also good. 1,674 5th-grade students participated in the competition, including 47 from our school.
- On 19 April, the international mathematics competition Náboj took place, where five-member teams of students representing their schools participated. In the younger age group (up to grade 10), the team with Uku-Märt Raasik (10b), Uku Nael (10b), Nurkhan Torekhanov (Pre-IB) and Sherkhan Torekhanov (Pre-IB) took 6th place in the Estonian ranking; 23rd place went to the grade team of 8b consisting of Leo Fišel, Tambet Uustare, Rasmus Kraav, Ats Joosep Laineste and Ott Loper; The 26th place team consisted of Lennart Sein (8a), Sulev Möls (8a), Mattias Vija (8a), Edward 19(10c) and Brent Gregr Smirnov (10a). In the older age group (grades 11-12), the team with Karolin Ruumet (11a), Martin Põder (11b), Tõnu Uustare (12DP), Laur Saks (12DP) and Kristjan Sarapuu (11b) took 6th place.
- On 11 March, Estonia's largest space competition for schoolchildren, Astronaut, began. The winners will fly to France in August to experience a weightless flight there! To date, 174 competitors have remained in the competition, including Tom Alfred Kullman (6b), Kaia Oder (7b), Adele Mikelsaar (8b), Villem Piirimäe (9b), and Mart Väljamäe (10b).
- In the interactive learning game of the city of Tartu for 7th grade students learning Russian took place at Annelinna Gymnasium on 18 April, MHG students were successful: Rahel Värton (teacher Maret Vaab), whose team won 1st place, Adeele Jaht (teacher Jelena Nikolajeva), whose team won 2nd place, Mihkel Ilves (teacher Külli Pullerits), whose team took 4th place, Helena Mai Raudvassar (Jelena Nikolajeva), whose team came in 6th place and Laura Markus (Külli Pullerits), whose team came in 7th place.
