




#### **NOTICED AT HÄRMA**

On 8-9 October, the autumn seminar of LKK was held in Pärnu, where our Head of Development, Tiia Lepik shared our school's good experiences of LKK teamwork. #### **PRACTICUM "DIFFERENT ESTONIAS"**

Last week, MHG secondary school graduating classes visited the capital city and the Estonian Military Museum in Viimsi as part of the "Different Estonias" practicum.

During the field trip, the Vabamu Museum of Occupations and Freedom was visited, which was opened on 1 July 2003 with the support of Olga Kistler-Ritso's donation. The students of Miina Härma Gümnaasium were welcomed by Ede Schank-Tamkivi, who deals with educational projects and presented the museum's structure, purpose and exhibits in a very interesting and engaging way. Then, a meeting with the **members of the Broken Cornflower Association** took place in Vabamu. These are Estonian children deported in 1949 who got the opportunity to return from Siberia after Stalin's death. The so-called "Siberian youth" spoke to secondary school students about the experience of deportation through the eyes of a child. About their families coping with life, the situation in the Tomsk and Irkutsk regions, the journey back to their homeland, and what awaited them here. **The conversations with the "Siberian youth" were touching and unforgettable for the rest of our lives because none of us gets any younger.** 

In addition, in collaboration with the Estonian Institute of Remembrance, we visited all three memorials in Maarjamäe. During the tour, Allar Tui, the communications manager of the institute, gave a thorough introduction to the Memorial to the Victims of Communism in Estonia. The history and purpose of the memorial were explained in detail, as well as the principles of entering individuals on its memorial walls and electronic memorial. In addition, students were taught to use the electronic database and read additional information from it. From the Memorial to the Victims of Communism, we moved to the adjacent Tallinn Maarjamäe German War Cemetery. The cemetery's scale and the buried soldiers' role in the Second World War and Estonian history were discussed. Finally, we also stopped at the ENSV Maarjamäe memorial and obelisk, where the guide vividly reflected the Soviet-era tactics of creating the desired image of the approach to history through symbolism.

#### PRACTICUM "DIFFERENT ESTONIAS"


The last stop was the Estonian War Museum in Viimsi, where the 113th graduate year of MHG was introduced to the history of the dignified building, the wars that took place on Estonian territory, the participation of Estonian men in the armed units of different countries, the story of the formation of the national army and military cooperation today. Students also had the opportunity to try on different uniforms and handle paraphernalia. In the museum's outdoor area, the students could take a closer look at the armoured train, and in the military equipment hangar, they stopped at the more exciting exhibits.
