#### **HEAD OF SCHOOL, ENE TANNBERG'S CHRISTMAS GREETINGS**

Dear school family!

The year 2024 is becoming history. The important keywords of the ending year in Tartu have been related to being the European Capital of Culture. Our school family also participated in the activities of the Capital of Culture. One of the secondarylights was the participation of all our choirs and folk dance groups in the Tartu Song and Dance Festival in June. After a seven-year break, a spring concert was held again, and we revived the choir exchange with the mixed choir and orchestra of a partner school in Bielefeld, Germany. secondary-level collaborative concerts occurred in Bielefeld in April and Tartu in September. A collaborative concert of our children's choir and the EMÜ male choir Gaudeamus was held as a new initiative on Father's Day. Härmatis folk dancers introduced our dance culture at an international cultural festival in Nepal in the spring.

The students' most notable achievements include winning the TV show Rakett69 and winning the first prize in the national student research paper competition. The debaters debated to become the best Estonian debate school, and our students represented Estonia at the World Debate Championship. We recognized almost a fifth of the secondary school graduates with a gold or silver medal.

Several student initiatives deserve recognition, such as restoring the **Citizens' Day debate tradition**, **organizing a school ball**, **and organizing a second- hand fair**.

In regular study circles, our teachers learn how to better teach approaches to learning. The teams of the **Schools in Motion** and **KiVa programs** are active.

The city government plans to reconstruct our school's yard into a sports and recreation area in the new year, offering many opportunities. After this construction work, our schoolyard should no longer turn into a small Venice, as it did last summer.
