BEGINNING OF THE ESTONIAN BOOK YEAR

- In 2025, it will be 500 years from the publication of the first Estonian-language book. Thus, the Year of the Estonian Book will take place from Estonian Literature Day, 30 January 2025, to Mother Language Day, March 14, 2026. On January 29, we will celebrate this event at school with a ceremony for secondary school students in the Aula during the 5th lesson.
- Marja Unt, CEO of the Estonian Literary Society, who also coordinates the Book Year events, will greet us. Students who will also perform at the Tammsaare Texts Reading Competition in Albu on January 31 will present the writer's work at the event.
- The official start of the book year will be on 30 January at sunrise at the Kristjan Jaak Peterson monument on Toomemägi. Terevision will broadcast the event live, and students from our school will also participate. At 8:15, the President of the Republic of Estonia, Alar Karis, will give an interview. The ceremony will begin at 8:22 with the reading of poems and end no later than 9:00.


