CELEBRATING MIINA HÄRMA'S 161ST BIRTH ANNIVERSARY

On 10 February, on the occasion of Miina Härma's 161st birth anniversary, class representatives gathered at Raadi Cemetery. Candles were lit to mark the birthday, and DP coordinator and history teacher **Ilmar Tammisto** reminded the students of Miina Härma's importance in history.





Delving into **Miina Härma's** life and work, it is difficult to feel anything but awe and admiration for one person's will to act and sense of mission. When talking about Miina Härma, it is customary to point out what she was the first in - **the first Estonian woman with a higher education, the first Estonian female composer, and to give an idea of Miina Härma's diversity, the founder of the first Estonian kindergarten.**

It is also worth considering the society in which Miina Härma operated. After all, all these achievements came in spite of a strongly male-centric society, where an enterprising woman had to prove herself at every step and show that, for example, a woman can do it just as well as a man by writing a choral song. Of course, in Miina Härma's example, she could even do it better than most of her contemporaries.

We are used to thinking about Miina Härma primarily from a national perspective. However, when we think about Miina Härma's youth, it is very international. Years of study and life in the capital of the Russian Empire, St. Petersburg, concert tours in Germany and England. Miina Härma could have easily succeeded in the wider world, become a citizen of the world in St. Petersburg, Berlin or London.

Yet she decided to take these valuable experiences gained abroad and bring them back to her homeland. Without these experiences and acquaintances, Miina Härma's years of activity in Estonia would certainly not have been so outstanding. Thus, she combined the international and the national. If I could give those present here today one recommendation in which to take an example from Miina Härma, I would highlight this aspect. Young people, travel, study or gain work experience abroad. These experiences are extremely valuable. At the same time, remember that here is your home, which is always waiting for you.



- Helena Mai Raudvassar (8a) has been invited to the final round of the Science Olympiad. The Science Olympiad consists of two competition rounds. The first, regional round, takes place in the first half of the academic year. In the regional competition, participants solve theoretical problems in the sciences. The problems are primarily from the fields of chemistry, physics and biology, they are close to life and integrate several scientific disciplines at once. The second round of the Olympiad, the final round, takes place in the second half of the year and consists of experimental problems and theoretical problems related to experiments in the same scientific fields. Based on the results of the Science Olympiad, the jury will nominate candidates for the Estonian team to participate in the International Science Olympiad (IJSO).
- One of the authors of the collection of **lesson plans on cultural diversity** is our school's English teacher **Tiina Tubli**. The collection, prepared in collaboration with MTÜ Mondo, consists of lesson plans that support students' understanding of different aspects of multiculturalism and develop intercultural dialogue and critical thinking skills. The plans are designed for grades 2 to secondary school and use active learning methods students can search for information, solve problems and put themselves in different roles to explore the themes of cultural richness and identity.

Activities include, for example, analysis of population data, discussion of the perception of beauty in different cultures, research into multiple identities, and awareness of stereotypes.
