- On 9 April, the Hydrogen Competition took place, where Uku Nael (11DP), Uku Märt Raasik (11DP), Andri Türkson (12b) and Ralf Jürgenson (12DP) formed one team. The competition began at TalTech with a theory test on hydrogen energy. After that, the teams had to build an electrolyser that produced hydrogen gas. A rocket had to be built for this hydrogen gas, and the team whose rocket flew the farthest won. Our team received a special prize for the most beautiful rocket.
- From 17-20 April, **Enginaator**, a national for engineering competition secondary school, vocational school, and university students, took place at TalTech. A total of 128 participants from every corner of Estonia took part. From our school, Uku Nael (11DP) and Mart Väljamäe (11b) (together with two others, team Rapsiõli), Ralf Jürgenson and Andri **Türkson** (together with two others, team Shawty diode) and **Uku Märt Raasik** (11DP) (together with two others, team Pakett69) participated. Rapsiõli participated in the IT preliminary round and took 2nd place, and Shawty diode took 1st place in the electronics preliminary round.



Teams Rapsiõli and Shawty diode reached the final, where they had to build a pinball machine. Rapeseed Oil came in 4th place and Shawty Diode came in 3rd place. The top three teams in the finals received cash prizes. The top five teams secured study places at TalTech and each member of their team received a gift bag.

On 25-27 April, NBPhO (Nordic and Baltic Physics Olympiad) took place at TalTech.
